COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Joining FORCEs Conference is an international conference that presents topics and research focused on hereditary breast and ovarian cancer syndrome. The conference is open to anyone concerned about hereditary cancer: breast and ovarian cancer survivors, high-risk individuals, people with a BRCA mutation or family history of cancer, patient advocates and health care providers who treat high-risk patients.
