



McLaren Health Care Nurses:

Advance Your Career with a Nursing Degree from Grand Valley State University

McLaren Health Care (MHC) and Grand Valley State University (GVSU) are transforming the nursing workforce by targeting the need to increase nursing educational opportunities for nurses from disadvantaged backgrounds and underrepresented minorities.

This program provides financial support for qualified students from MHC, who gain admission into select GVSU Kirkhof College of Nursing (KCON) programs. Graduates will be able to deliver culturally aligned care and leadership in providing care for medically underserved areas and populations.

MHC nurses will be selected for the following degree programs. Each program is 5 semesters long with applied learning experiences in the MHC system:

- Associate Degree Registered Nurse (RN) to BSN program (online format): 19 nurses
- Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) Clinical Nurse Leader program (online and in-person format): 6 nurses admission process will begin in Fall 2023
- Post MSN to Doctor of Nursing Practice Health Systems Leadership (DNP-HSL) program (online and in-person format): 5 nurses

Admitted MHC nurses will be individually responsible for approximately 20% of their tuition/program fees. The remainder of the program cost will be funded by GVSU, MHC, and the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA).
