- 2. Discuss how lack of funding, social determinants, and inequitable access to resources and healthcare impact underrepresented communities, especially for Black maternal health patients.
- 3. Describe how medical racism impacts the quality of care Black birthing mothers experience in healthcare settings.
- Identify tools to advocate and amplify Black women's voices when medical bias is present.
- 5. Identify additional birthing options that support Black mothers in the birthing process.
