Signs & Symptoms and Screening Criteria

WHAT IS LUNG CANCER?

Lung cancer happens when abnormal cells form in the lungs and grow out of control. These cells can form a tumor and can spread to other parts of the body. Lung cancer is often diagnosed once it has spread outside the lungs. About 9 out of every 10 people with lung cancer die from the disease because it is found after it has spread.

Who	Should	Be	Screened	For
Lung	Cancer	?		

You are eligible for a

T Lung Screening if you:						
	Are between 55 and 75 years old					
	Smoked for 30 or more pack years, who quit less than 15 years ago					
Are 50 years plus, smoked for 20 or more pack years, and have at least one more risk factor than second-hand smoke						
CALCULATING PACK YEARS: (20 cigarettes = 1 pack)						
	Number of years smoked					
	Average number of packs smoked per day					
	= Pack-years					

Questions for my doctor:

Lung Cancer Signs & Symptoms

Talk to your doctor if you have any of the following signs or symptoms:

- Cough that lasts
- Chest pain that is often worse with deep breathing, coughing, or laughing
- Hoarseness
- Weight loss and loss of appetite
- Coughing up blood or rust-colored sputum (spit or phlegm)
- Shortness of breath
- Tiredness that lasts
- Pneumonia
- Noticing new wheezing sounds with your breathing
- Pain when swallowing
