Implementation Plans Targeting Identified Community Health Needs

Action Plan #1 – Improved healthy eating and physical activity for cardiovascular disease prevention

- Complete an internal community health assessment to identify employees at risk for heart disease and identify educational, physical and emotional opportunities for those at risk.
- Provide cardiovascular risk screenings and prevention information at community events and health fairs.
- Participate in the Great Smoke out, to educate the community on tobacco cessation.
- Apply for grant funding to support cardiac education programs.
- Participate in Red Ribbon Week to demonstrate and educate on the dangers of drug abuse.
- Assist the community with performing a self-evaluation for heart disease using tools such as My Life Check.
- Offer monthly diabetes and diabetes nutrition basics courses to the community.
- Offer free sports physicals to children in Oakland County to encourage participation in sports.
- Offer the Faithful Families Program to residents through local Churches. The program is designed to offer healthy alternatives in diet and exercise to improve overall health.
- Continue membership in the Healthy Pontiac We Can initiative. The program promotes healthy eating and living tobacco free lives.

Action Plan #2 – Expanded access to health care through convenient scheduling, better transportation, navigation services and affordability.

- Provide options to patients with transportation issues; transportation vouchers, van, and access to outside services.
- Provide the first mobile clinic in Oakland County and provide health screenings, vaccinations and medical assistance.
- Provide assistance with copays and deductibles to low income patients.
- Provide a patient navigator that will follow patients with cancer diagnosis from biopsy through treatment.

Action Plan #3 - Increased regular screenings to prevent late-stage diagnoses. Skin Cancer Screening

• Provide skin cancer screening events in the community.

- Provide educational material at health fairs and community events regarding skin cancer prevention.
- Provide sunscreen to the community at events and health fairs.

HPV Prevention Education

- Provide HPV education to local women's shelters
- Provide vaccinations to communities most at risk

Provide free mammograms to uninsured and underinsured women in Oakland County at three

- Provide helmets and head injury education to every second grader in the Waterford, Clarkston, Oxford and Pontiac school district.
- Provide resources to educate the community healthcare providers and their patients on EHAC.
- Partner with local EMS provider to offer free community courses on EHAC/Hands-only CPR curriculum.
- Provide access to a 911 simulator and educate children on how and when to call 911.
- Provide access to a distracted driver simulator to educate teens and adults on the dangers of texting and drinking while driving.
- Launch the Stop the Bleed campaign and educate teachers on how to correctly apply proper bleeding control techniques and equip high schools in four districts with Stop the Bleed kits.
