New outreach program engages communities across Michigan

There is no population group in America that cancer doesn't touch. But the disease hits some harder than others.

Numerous cancer health disparities affect groups defined by race, ethnicity, gender/sexual identity, geographic location, income and other factors.

For example, Hispanic women have higher rates of cervical cancer than women of other ethnic groups, according to the American Cancer Society. African American women have the highest death rate from this disease. People with lower education levels are more likely to die before age 65 from colorectal cancer than people with more education. <u>LEARN MORE</u>.
